This method encourages communication between those involved in the interactive learning process. As it is known from experience, when artistic ability is required, students' desire to learn increases significantly. In order for the conversation to be more interesting, an actual issue should be taken up. When boring topics are chosen, the level of activity of the participants drops sharply. The topic used during the experimental lesson aroused the interest of everyone, as can be seen in the video footage.

In conclusion, the use of advanced, communicative games, along with the conservative methods that are used to develop students' reading skills, can develop language skills faster than expected.
