According to the legend, Nebuchadnezzar fell in love with the queen of Media, a country located on the southern coast of the Caspian Sea. After receiving the consent of the queen, he made a big wedding for the country and took his young wife to the center, to Babylon. When the princess came to Babylon, she was suffering from the weather, that was hot, and her heart was depressed. Then Nebuchadnezzar decided to build a garden that reminded her the green fields and beautiful gardens of Midia (pic. 1). According to his order, the most famous builders and skilled architects of the world were gathered and started the work. A huge

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tower was built. Huge rocks were used for the structure. The tower had four floors. Each floor was built in the form of a circular dome, and they were supported by a tall stone pillar. The top of porches were closed with reeds and covered with asphalt.

After that, it was covered with bricks and was put laiden plates prevent from water splashing on the porches. A large amount of fine soil was put on the top and spreaded thickly over the entire roof. The soil was so thick that even perennial trees could be planted in it. The rare flowers and decorative trees which grown there were brought from the princess's homeland. To irrigate this garden, they took water from the river Frot. Hundreds of slaves were turning the huge wheel with the leather vessels that lifted the water to the top, day and night. The princess walked from floor to floor of the building on wide stairs covered with pink and white marble. This wonder of the world is located in the territory of the current state of Iraq. Many travelers who came to Babylon rushed to see the Mesopotamian wonders that stunned the world.

Such a garden, which was built in the time of King Nebuchadnezzar, was not liked in any country in the world. That's why this garden started to be mentioned as one of the seven wonders of the world. Today's tourists and travelers cannot see the beautiful gardens described by Herodotus. Now, only the ruins of the tower and porches remain in place of those gardens. German archaeologist Robert Koldevoy found the ruins of the hanging garden and wondered how it was watered. This garden was destroyed during various battles and especially during the conquest of Babylon by the Persian king Kaykhusrav, and over time it was buried under huge sand dunes.
